2013-2014 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

It is my pleasure to report on the Coopers Brewery Foundation activities for the 2013 – 2014 year.

This year has seen the Foundation distribute over \$2.5 million in charitable funds since our first donation in March 2007. Over the past financial year, the Foundation provided \$433,200 to 27 Australian charitable projects.

Foodbank was this year's recipient charity of the Golf day. Despite the challenging weather conditions on the day, a record amount of \$97,005 was raised for the event. These funds will assist in the establishment of a new Northern Foodbank Centre at the Pooraka Markets, to ensure the capture of hundreds of tonnes of fresh fruit and vegetables for those in need.

Our shareholders once again responded very positively to both last year's Annual Report, and the Shareholder Appeal request in May, donating \$41,600 to support the Leukaemia Young Bloods Appeal. This program assists seriously ill young people who have been diagnosed with the disease, and are transitioning back to life, subsequent to diagnosis.

The Foundation continues to benefit from the non-operational fundraising efforts by the dedicated team at Coopers including tours, conducted by Frank Akers, which raised over \$42,000, and recycling of waste material, managed by Frank Perrotta, generating over \$59,000.

Our thanks go to Patron Glenn Cooper and Governor Tim Cooper for continuing to support the Foundation by giving talks to industry groups, raising just under \$10,000 this year. Other fundraising income includes payment of over \$6,000 from Beerenberg for the use of the Coopers logo on their Coopers Ale Barbeque Sauce.

Our suppliers and Friends have also continued to support the Foundation with donations of over \$190,000. Special mention goes to Bill and Jo Cooper, Premium Beverages, Castlegate James, and Allianz, as well as our employees who have given more than \$10,000.

Although no concert was held at the Brewery this year, plans are in place for an event next February featuring Sting and Paul Simon, and Coopers has again committed the venue hire proceeds to the Foundation.

Following the donation made by Coopers Brewery last year of \$2,000,000, an Investment Committee was formed to oversee the management and investment of those funds. As Chair of that Committee, I would like to thank our Secretary Haydn Duffield and fellow members Jim Hazel, Michael Shearer, Simon Hele and Rob Patterson for their time and efforts in establishing the group and managing the funds. Subsequent to the original investment, Coopers has made a further donation of \$500,000 prior to the end of the financial year. The income raised from interest in the first year was more than \$70,000, and with prudent

investment in a diverse portfolio, to be managed by Macquarie Private Wealth, this corpus should

grow significantly over the long term.

Our Executive Officer Ginta Orchard and I completed the annual corporate governance review as part of the Foundation's internal audit. Once again I want to acknowledge the work and advice Ginta has given, as well as the voluntary work she has provided for the Foundation. In the coming year, as agreed with the Coopers Board of Directors, the part-time executive officer's fees will be paid from income earned in the corpus.

Our auditors KPMG have once again conducted the audit of the accounts and I thank the team for their assistance and advice. Finally, I wish to thank the Board of Governors for their continued efforts and support of the Foundation, ensuring the mission and objectives are achieved. In particular, I would like to acknowledge the contributions of Rex Keily AM, a founding Governor since 2006. Mr Keily has indicated to me that he will not stand for re-election at the end of this report, and I would like to thank him, on behalf of my fellow Governors, for his wise guidance and the experience he brought to the Foundation, gained through his extensive work with charities. We wish him well in the future.

In closing, I want to acknowledge everyone who contributed to this year's result. With their help, funding of \$2.5 million to over 170 charitable projects has been achieved since inception. I take this opportunity to reinforce that 100% of donations and funds raised (net of GST) for the Foundation are distributed to charities. We will continue to achieve our mission to make a difference, brewing support for the community.
